

Sunday Gospel Reflection:

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

1. Sign of the Cross

2. Gospel: John 1: 35-42 *“Come and see”*

The First Disciples of Jesus

³⁵ The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, ³⁶ and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, “Look, here is the Lamb of God!” ³⁷ The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. ³⁸ When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” (which translated means Teacher), “where are you staying?” ³⁹ He said to them, “Come and see.” They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon. ⁴⁰ One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. ⁴¹ He first found his brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated Anointed). ⁴² He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas” (which is translated Peter).



3. Reflection: (reflect on your own or share together if with others)

1. Jesus asks this question not just to the disciples but to us too. So, let us picture ourselves in this gospel scene. Jesus is talking to us and ask us, “What are you looking for?” How would you respond? What would you tell him?
2. Jesus asks the disciples to “come and see” and the scriptures tell us that they stayed with Jesus. How do we “stay” with Jesus? What are some ways in your live that you can “stay” or “remain” with Jesus especially given our times?
